

What Did I Just Ask?

The game...

You ask your caller a series of questions; they have to answer each question slightly out of sync. I.e. you ask question 1, they say nothing; you ask question 2, they give the answer to question 1; you ask question 3, they give the answer to question 2 and so on.

Script your questions carefully and you can gear the answer to question 4 for example, to be an absurd, hilarious or even risqué answer to question 5. This is the way to add the fun element to the game and keep your caller on their toes!

To help keep your question writing simple, you may wish to use categories for each series of questions you write.

Suggested set-up...

This can be carried over several links, allowing for a second or third caller depending on the success or failure of the first caller or can be tightened up to fit within a ten-fifteen minute block of your show.

Link 1

"We're playing What Did I Just Ask within the next ten minutes, this morning's category is numbers, call me on... if you can answer the following question... *How many days are there in June?* If you can answer that question correctly, you're already 10% of the way to winning... <prize>"

Link 2

Go through questions with caller. If they answer all correctly, they're your winner. If they don't...

"<caller 1> took us through the first 6 questions this morning, just slipping on question number 7. Where you shouting the answer at your radio? If so <prize> could be yours. I'm looking for somebody to go all the way with me this morning playing What Did I Just Ask, if that's you, call me in the studio now on..."

Link 3

Repeat link 2, until you have a winner. If nobody successfully answers all questions, the caller who got the furthest could be your winner, or you can roll the game over to the following day (a handy trick to save on script writing!).

Some sample questions and categories follow...

Category: Numbers

1. How many days are there in June?
 2. How old does a baby become on their 1st birthday? *30*
 3. How old do you have to be to drive in the UK? *1*
 4. What is 2 + 3? *17*
 5. How many eyes do you have? *5*
 6. How many heads do you have? *2*
 7. In darts, what's the highest score with 3 darts? *1*
 8. How many ounces in a pound? *180*
 9. How many days in a week? *16*
 10. How many nostrils do you have? *7*
 11. How many people does it take to fall in love? *2*

Category: Countries & Places

1. Which country celebrates Independence Day on 4th July?
2. Disneyland Paris is situated in which country? *USA*
3. Prince Charles is also known as the Prince of...? *France*
4. Aborigines are the original natives of which country? *Wales*
5. Famous prison known as The Rock? *Australia*
6. Just 90 mls off the Florida Keys, country known for its rather potent cigars? *Alcatraz*
7. Good people go there when they die? *Cuba*
8. Mythical place in Scotland, appears once every 50 yrs? *Heaven*
9. Party Island known for its night clubs and 18-30 holiday packages? Also a car by SEAT? *Brigadoon*
